EDITORS' NOTE: Where available, the titles and details of paintings exhibited by McCahon in each exhibition have been indicated. These titles and details have been listed as per the original catalogue or list of each exhibition. It should be noted that in a number of instances these titles have subsequently been altered, either by the artist or, more recently, as a result of attempts by the McCahon Research and Publication Trust to standardise painting nomenclature.

Although every endeavour has been made to compile as complete an exhibition list as possible, timing and other constraints have meant that this must necessarily be published as a 'work in progress'. It is the editors' hope that other researchers will use this as a starting point for further investigation towards the eventual compilation of a definitive listing.

All prices given are in the New Zealand currency of the time unless otherwise noted.

1939

Otago Art Society Exhibition, Dunedin, November 1939 No catalogue or exhibition list traced.

The exhibition possibly included a painting of 'the Moutere hills' (referred to in a letter to Toss Woollaston, 8.12.1939, quoted in Gerald Barnett, Toss Woollaston, an illustrated biography, Wellington: National Gallery of Art – Random Century, 1991, p. 51) and/or the first Otago Peninsula painting (referred to by McCahon in an interview with Gordon Brown, 14 March 1979, unpublished typescript, based on three cassette tapes, deposited with the Alexander Turnbull Library, Wellington.)

McCahon remained an Artist Member of the OAS until 1945. No catalogues or exhibition lists for these years have been traced but it may be assumed he exhibited in each of the annual Society Exhibitions for the period 1939–1945.

In an installation photograph of the exhibition there appear three unrecorded paintings: a Crucifixion with a watching woman, set against a background of multiple landscapes; an unrecorded image of Christ's head on St Veronica's handkerchief, which may be an early state of *Ecce Homo* 1949; and a dual landscape image showing day and night views. This may be the *Night and Day* painting mentioned in an unpublished review of the exhibition by Ron O'Reilly, held in the Helen Hitchings Gallery papers at the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa Archive (although this reference may also be to *Takaka: night and day*). In the same review, an otherwise unrecorded painting, *Hills and Valleys*, is mentioned. This, equally, may be another name for *Takaka: night and day*.
